## Registration Directions


1. Register online using [WebSTAR](#).

Click on: Enter Secure Area and follow the on-screen directions.

2. To register, you will need your  CRN, SharkLink ID (NSU ID) and PIN.

More than one section is offered for each course. Should you want to remain with your cohort colleagues, you are **MUST** register early and register within the same section. If we have to combine or split sections as registration progresses, **changes will be made based on registration date**. Please register early. Every attempt will be made to honor your section requests, but please understand that sometimes we must move students to achieve optimum course counts. If one section is full, please register for another section. We are not able to lift caps on sections or to move students into sections that are full.

- To drop or add a course, complete the student transaction form ([student transaction.pdf](#)) and fax it to (954) 262-2336 and (800) 725-5508. You will need to complete this form if you make a mistake while registering online or if you need to drop a class once you've registered.
- Once you've registered for your course(s), any changes will be governed by NSU's withdrawal policy. The complete policy is available at <http://www.schoolofed.nova.edu/fgshome/fgscatalogs.htm>. In summary, Students who cancel their registration before the first class session are entitled to a full tuition refund. GTEP's fees are not refundable. After the first class, students who inform the program director of their intention to withdraw will receive a prorated refund of tuition. If the applicant does not meet the minimum 2.5 GPA or GRE score requirement, the applicant may enroll in a maximum of six (6) credit hours and must earn a grade of B or better in each course during the first term of enrollment for **conditional admission**. Students who do not earn a grade of B or better in each course will be subject to dismissal from the program.
